<b>Introduction: Topic Overview/Purpose</b>	No clear introduction to start paper off, or tone is off (too informal).	There is an introduction, but tone is off (too informal). <b>Conclusion- summary</b>	No clear conclusion, or tone is off (too informal).	There is an introduction, but tone is off (too informal).	Tone of the introduction is clear, formal writing.	closing interesting, explains why the issue is important, and concludes with a nice summary.	5 points
<b>Presentation (prepared and organized), ability to answer questions if asked, clear</b>	Presentation was not prepared and shown.
